

National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Responds



Above, Eagle Chapter roses recognize Security Forces Airmen each year during Police Week who have paid the ultimate sacrifice but have yet to be recognized by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial (NLEOM) in Washington DC.

As you may recall, one of the managers at the NLEOM committed to re-examine Security Forces Airmen that General Hertog nominted in 2008 to be recognized by the memorial The difference this time is they committed to examine the actions of the Airmen at the time of their death and not the disqualifying factor of being in a combat zone where previously the NLEOM had ruled didn't allow them to recognie our SF Airmen who were killed in Iraq or Afghanistan.

They completed their review and I received a response that requires further action. I was surprised that **the NLEOM review included a complete review of all Air Force submissions that were unresolved.** During this review, they found two SF Airmen who appear to qualify for recognition.

These two Airmen are

- <u>In 2002, Airman Jacob Charles Partridge</u> was killed when a patrol car struck him while he was serving at Eielson AFB, Alaska; and
- in 1956, Capt. George Edgar Morris was providing security around an aircraft accident when a tire exploded, killing him. Capt. Morris was serving at Kirtland AFB NM.
