# Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act (LEOSA)

Below, Eagle Member, Colonel Retired Bob Pike provides his experience and recommendations for folks who are interested in concealed carry for the state of Maryland.

Thanks to Eagle Member, Colonel Retired Bob Pike, for providing these instructions. This reflects his experience in applying for LEOSA through the state of Maryland.

In order to qualify, Air Force personnel need to have at least 10 years service in security police, air police, security forces or Air Force Office of Special Investigation. DCS is the contractor that is responsible for running the application program. You can reach them by clicking here, select "U.S. Air Force" under the Service Branch tab, upper left top and READ everything. Then select APPLY NOW to get an account created. Next, go to the Checklist section and scroll down to "926C Retired" for example, select that, and you will have the application process spelled out there.

First, print out the application, then read the digital passport requirements-you need to get a digital photo from CVS or FEDEX, etc. and have it placed on your thumb drive. Then you can upload it to DCS in your account. Next, go to a local sheriff/state police office for fingerprint cards (2) that you will have to send in to get your electronic background check. You will have to go through an FBI contractor called a "channeler"they have a list to choose from at the <u>CJIS site-to get the</u> <u>background check</u>. Then print out the report they send you later (3-4 weeks).

Next, copy your driver's license–both sides. Unless you were medically retired, you don't need the medical certification. Finally, you need a certified copy (raised seal) of your DD214– get one through www.archives.gov.

Once you have obtained all of the stuff they want, make sure you get the application form notarized and send it off to DCS with the fee. If approved you should get your LEOSA ID card in about 2-3 months--but you aren't done yet!

To legally carry concealed under Title 18, you also must have a current (within the last 12 months) firearms qualification from an approved organization in the state of your residence shown on your LEOSA ID card.

For me, I live in Charles County and the Sheriff's Office holds LEOSA qualifications 1st and 3rd Thursdays most every month at a range located at Middleton Hall, near Waldorf, MD. The course of fire is 60 rounds–day and reduced visibility–3, 7, 10 yards, strong hand, weak hand, kneeling and standing barricade. I think there are other organizations in Maryland who shoot LEOSA people, including Prince Georges Community College. While you are waiting for your ID card, it might be prudent to get out to a range for several days and get up to speed on your shooting skills with the weapon you plan to carry.

Once qualified, you can carry concealed, but there are several restrictions-no federal buildings, court houses, post offices, national parks, and in Maryland, courts, police offices, state

buildings, school grounds, and state parks—so be sure to find out all of the nonos—you can go to jail. Best to install a gun vault in your vehicles. I recommend a small one with a cable wrapped around the seat frame— when you need to stow it temporarily. And no drinking while carrying – you can go to jail. The rules for carrying on bases and installations are still up for grabs – call the local Security Forces organization to check.

**Finally, remember you have NO POLICE POWERS.** You may use your weapon to defend yourself or others only if your life or theirs is threatened. And, concealed means concealed–don't brag, flaunt, or imply to anyone that you are armed, and I recommend a minimum \$1 million personal liability policy to cover yourself.
